#### 1. INTRODUCTION

- 1) This report presents the Semi Annual Social Monitoring Report (SASMR) for Sindh Secondary Education Improvement Project (SSEIP).
- 2) This report is the 2nd SASMR for the SSEIP project covering activities for the period of January 2022 to June 2022.
- 3) The information provided in this report is time bound and the ground realities presented in this report may change with the passage of time.
- 4) For accessing the impacts and mitigation measures of social impacts as a direct result of SSEIP activities, it provides for employing services of Environmental and Social Specialist (ESS) and Gender Specialist (GS) at PIU level as well as Design & Supervision (DSC) Firm and Teachers' Training Assessment Firm (TTAF). The Environment and Social Safeguard Specialist (ESS) looks directly into aspects related to Due-diligence, Land Acquisition, Involuntary Resettlement Livelihood Restoration, Resettlement Monitoring, Grievance Redress, Indigenous People Safeguard for Output-01 only while gender related issues including but not limited to Affected female, safeguard of female cultural, hygiene issues, female Community consultations for output-01 will be covered by Gender Specialist. Gender Specialist will also look beyond Output-01 for the previously mentioned themes.
- 5) PIU-Environmental & Social Safeguard (ESS) Specialist, being the author of this report attempts to recollect and document information available with PIU in a just and unbiased manner.
- 6) PIU-SSEIP acknowledges the efforts and guidance provided by ADB project team to members of PIU Team for the execution of SSEIP.

#### 2. SCOPE OF THE REPORT

7) Social Safeguard measures in this report are limited to design phase and construction phase of Output-01 only i.e. New secondary school blocks constructed, and operated under EMO program.

#### 3. BACKGROUND OF THE PROJECT

- 8) Education indicators for Pakistan indicate low adult literacy rate, low expected years of schooling, considerable challenges in access to education and quality of education.
- 9) Educational challenges in Sindh are more acute than in other provinces of Pakistan generally which in addition also include poor quality education, and weak education governance and management.
- 10) The project will support the strengthening of inclusive growth, which is a key objective of ADB's strategy.
- 11) According to ADB's category; this project has the following safeguard ratings:

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- 12) According to ADB's website, Sindh Secondary Education Improvement Project is a Gender Equity Project which is the highest ratings so far for a project in favour of Gender safeguard projects
- 13) The Project will contribute towards SDG-4 (Ensure Inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all); and SDG-5 (Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls).
- 14) Sindh Secondary Education Improvement Project (SSEIP) will support reforms initiated by Government of Sindh in the education sector as a result of major challenges faced at post-primary level in Sindh.
- 15) SSEIP is aligned with Sindh Education Sector Policy (SESP) 2014 -2018 (and subsequent SESP 2019- 2023) as it will support investments and capacity building in secondary education throughout the province of Sindh.
- 16) The project has 3 outputs which are given as follows:
  - Output-01: New secondary school blocks constructed, and operated under EMO program
  - Output-02: Teaching capacity in five key subjects improved
  - Output-03: Secondary education examination system strengthened




Figure 1: Organization Chart of PIU-SSEIP

- 17) Project Organization Chart has been reproduced as Figure 1.

#### 5. PROJECT ACTIVITIES

19) Project activities executed in the current reporting period from January 2022 to June 2022 have been documented in this section.

#### Issues from Previous SASMR

20) ADB's TA Mr. Azeem, submitted his Social Due-diligence report (SDDR) to ADB on 30 Jan 2022. The report was forwarded to PIU-SSEIP by ADB's Project Team. PIU has some issues on the content of the Draft SDDR. PD-SSEIP has directed PIU to complete pending tasks and finalize the report as per the requirements of ADB SPS, Project and Contract documents.

### PIU-SSEIP contracts DSC Firm

- 21) SSEIP has contracted 'Design and Supervision Consulting (DSC)' Firm on 31st Dec 2021. Engineering Consultants International (Pvt.) Ltd. qualified as DSC firm for Output-1 of SSEIP. Project Director, Mr. Anees Dasti issued Notice to Proceed (NTP) to DSC Firm in Feb 2022.
- 22) ECIL, the DSC firm, has submitted to PIU a DRAFT *Inception Report* as its first deliverable on April 26<sup>th</sup> 2022 against the provided school list of 116 schools. List of these schools are provided as **Annexure I**. ECIL claims that it has completed its deliverable of Inception Report. Summary of activities completed and reported as of 30th June 2022 in Inception report is given as follows:

- 23) The major activity for this reporting period is the finalization of Architectural design of project schools. Project Director (PD)-SSEIP has been pivotal in finalization of school design through weekly meetings with DSC Firm.
- 24) It has been pointed out by ADB that Detailed design of school sites are being executed before final screening & due-diligence. It is unclear how many schools will drop as a result of final screening activity carried out by PIU-ESS and/or DSC-SS Specialist.

#### Finalization of Project Schools

- 25) Ninety-three (93) schools have been extracted from PC-1. These may be considered final as these are listed in PC-1 and High Priority List (HPL) of Schools from SELD. Another Twenty-Three (23) schools are from PC-1 but do not fall into HPL.
- 26) SSEIP conducted its first Project Steering Committee meeting on Friday 17th June 2022. It has been informed that "way forward additional 44 schools" have been approved. Further details can only be provided as soon as a copy of the approved minutes of meeting are received.

#### Mobilization of DSC Social Safeguard Specialist

- 27) PIU asked DSC to mobilize its Social Safeguard Specialist officially on Mar 25th, 2022 and required SS Specialist to present his plan for the assignment.
- 28) The Social Safeguard Specialist declined to join DSC firm for discharge of his duties. Since the issue of 'Notice To Proceed' to DSC Firm in Feb 2022, Social Safeguard activities are pending on DSC's end.
- 29) PIU has informed ECIL i.e. the DSC firm that its activities will not be considered complete until it has completed Social Safeguard activities falling in its share. PD-SSEIP has sent a reminder to ECIL to manage and complete its activities on time without any further delay.
- 30) ECIL (the DSC firm)'s Social Safeguard Specialist has not been hired and mobilized for field activities as of 30th June 2022, it seems that ECIL is under appreciative of the Social Safeguard

requirements.

### <u>Due-diligence / Cross-Validation Visits</u>

- 31) In accordance with SSEIP-Resettlement Framework Para No. 40; "It was not possible to screen potential school sites during project appraisal.." and it requires, "Before awarding of any civil works contracts, Social Due Diligence including impact screening and assessment, identification and socio-economic analysis of potentially affected persons, preparation of requisite due diligence documents commensurate with the Social Impact Assessment to be furnished by Executing / Implementation Agency for all project school sites included in the project".
- 32) Further on in accordance with SSEIP-Resettlement Framework Para No. 41; "For screening and assessment of IR impacts, the safeguards specialist will closely coordinate with the project school design engineers in field surveys to discuss and suggest options to avoid and minimize IR impacts and to prepare SDDR and RPs if required accordingly"/
- 33) The standing instructions at PIU is to avoid selection of school sites that would trigger an Involuntary Resettlement impact and require preparation / implementation of Resettlement Procedures.
- 34) PIU did not conduct any Social Due-Diligence / Cross Validation field visits in this reporting period. Several visit requests were raised but no response was received on these requests.
- 35) <u>Logistic arrangements are still not complete at PIU's end to facilitate expert's visit to project school sites.</u> Future SASMReports will include details of any visit to project sites.
- 36) Finally, extracted here from SSEIP-Resettlement Framework states that the IR and IP impact significance of each school site will be determined through guidelines given in SSEIP-RF-Para42. These are given as following for ready reference of the reader.
  - i. School sites involving acquisition of additional land or schools' sites where land acquisition through donation is assumed in anticipation of ADB finances will be identified in each project district and excluded from the final list.
  - Land title record for project school sites will be reviewed and wherever required land title
    will be got mutated in the name of school or relevant government authority before execution
    of project works at site;
  - iii. Efforts will be ensured to confine project school building design within available school owned/ occupied land to avoid and minimize the IR impacts.
  - iv. Any IR and IP impacts likely to emerge from clearance of encroachments and established third party land uses will be assessed and documented.
  - v. Initial impact assessment and screening checklists including preliminary information about likely impacts and anticipated number of affected persons will be prepared for each project sites to guide preparation of consolidated SDDRs and RP, if so required for each project district.
- 37) Since ECIL, the DSC firm's Social Safeguard Specialist has not been mobilized as of 30th June 2022, it seems from the areas consumed in school designs that ECIL is unaware of the Social Safeguard requirements. Although all documents are publicly available at ADB's website but PIU will remind ECIL of these requirements as soon as it submits Bill of Quantities for schools.
- 38) Since ECIL (the DSC firm)'s Social Safeguard Specialist has not been mobilized for field activities as of 30th June 2022, it is inferred from the disclosed 'areas' shown in secondary school block maps that ECIL is unaware of the Social Safeguard requirements.

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#### Involuntary Resettlement and Resettlement Plans

- 39) With regards to Involuntary Resettlement (IR) issue / third party use of land within existing school boundary; the standing instructions at PIU is to avoid such schools that would require IR and RP.
- 40) Until PIU-ESS and/ or DSC-SS do not visit all school sites, it cannot be concluded with certainty that all schools are free from third party use.

#### *Voluntary Land Donation Agreement (VLDA)*

- 41) ADB TA during his visit has repeatedly requested PIU-PM to acquire Voluntary Land Donation Agreement for all project schools. PM forwarded the same to PD-PIU & DEOs.
- 42) In continuation to previous SASMR, Project Implementation Unit (PIU) intends to put in place strong social safeguard measures and demonstrate compliance with ADB's Safeguard Policy Standard 2009.
- 43) In this regard, PIU compiled a status of available documents it has previously collected. Following is the summary of status of VLDA documents for each district as of 21-06-2022.

44) Status of additional 23 schools is being prepared and will be shared soon via email and documented in the next SASMR. PIU will identify schools built on government owned land where VLDA would not be applicable.

#### Capacity Building / Training of PIU-SSEIP

45) Capacity Building or Training for any of the PIU-SSEIP / DSC-SS professional on any topic was not done physically or virtually.

#### Public Disclosure of previous SAEMR & SASMR

46) PIU submitted 1st Semi-Annual Environmental Monitoring Report (SAEMR) and Semi-Annual Social Monitoring Report (SASMR) for approval & disclosure at ADB project website. In order

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to comply with ADB's Public Disclosure requirement, PD-SSEIP has initiated design of website. As soon as the website becomes functional, SAEMR & SASMR will be uploaded for public disclosure.

#### 6. RESETTLEMENT MONITORING

- 47) During the current reporting period, there were no activities related to resettlement. PIU will be vigilant during the project lifecycle for any resettlement issues. Monitoring of resettlement issues will involve:
  - (i) administrative monitoring to ensure timely implementation and problem solving;
  - ii) socioeconomic monitoring during and after any resettlement impact utilizing baseline information established through the socioeconomic survey of DPs undertaken during preparation; and
  - (iii) overall monitoring to asses DPs' status.
- 48) The PIU through its DSC firm will be monitoring social issues. PIU will provide Social monitoring report to ADB on a semi-annual basis.

#### 7. GRIEVANCE REDRESS

- 49) In line with ADB's Policy requirements, the Project will establish a robust GRM at both PIU level and Project district level. Grievances will be addressed / resolved through Secretary, SELD-GOS notified GRC.
- 50) Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM) was reviewed and updated with minor changes. Modified GRM has been shared with Secretary SELD to notify Grievance Redress Committee (GRC) at PIU level. GRC has been notified in April 2022. Copy of GRC notification is attached as **Annexure-II**.
- 51) First grievance complaint was received on 12.05.2022 through DSC Firm. DSC Firm informed that Head Master GBPS Baqa Dahri did not allow DSC firm to conduct geotechnical surveys because Education Department had promised to award government school teaching job to the community. Although the grievance does not pertain to the project but the Project Director SSEIP has tasked Deputy Project Director to resolve this matter on the department level. Copy of Grievance Complaint is attached as **Annexure-III**.

#### 8. INDIGENOUS PEOPLE

52) This Project is classified as Category C as per the ADB's Safeguard category rating. Details of this category may be referenced from ADB's Safeguard Policy Statement 2009 and it implies that the project will not affect any indigenous people in the process of its implementation.

#### 9. POVERTY AND SOCIAL IMPACT

53) It is expected that this Project will increase awareness in girl population, enhance economic opportunities, create temporary livelihoods during construction of secondary school blocks, improved health and education, and elevate standard of living of communities in general.

#### 10. PUBLIC CONSULTATION AND DISCLOSURE

54) PIU-SSEIP understands that Public consultations are an important feedback mechanism during

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- project life.
- 55) No Public consultations were conducted during this reporting period.
- 56) DSC Social Safeguard Specialist along with Gender Specialist will conduct community consultations together during the Sub-project design phase. PIU-Team may join the consultation process subject to approval of PD-SSEIP and availability of logistics arrangements.

#### 11. MONITORING AND REPORTING

- 57) Grant agreement covenants, ADB's SPS, legal, environmental, social and gender safeguards are being monitored through Project Reviews Missions.
- 58) Safeguards Monitoring will be performed by PIU and its results will be included in the semiannual reports.

#### 12. PLANNED SOCIAL SAFEGUARD ACTIVITIES

- 59) The following activities have been planned for the next reporting period of July2022 to December 2022.
  - i. Mobilization of DSC's Social Safeguard Specialist for field activities.
  - ii. Conduct Meaning Community Consultation by DSC Social Safeguard Specialist with respect to proposed School designs. Preparation for Community Consultations in the form of visit plan, consultation methodology, identification of primary, secondary, key stakeholders, checklist/guided questionnaire etc.
  - iii. Collection & Verification of Land titles of school, proposed construction land parcel, donated land to avoid any third party claims etc. from Sindh Land Revenue Department, Government of Sindh.
  - iv. Social Impact Screening and identification of potential affected persons.
  - v. Preparation of Due-diligence documents as per SSEIP-Resettlement Framework.

#### 13. CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATIONS

- 60) Project Implementation Unit of Sindh Secondary Education Improvement Project will continue to comply with safeguard requirements set forth in updated SSEIP Project Administration Manual and subsequent related documents such as Environmental Assessment Review Framework, Resettlement Framework etc.
- 61) Strong followup will be maintained with DSC Firm to hire and mobilize its Social Safeguard Specialist so that project activities are carried out on time with any impact to project cost and time.
- 62) PIU-ESS along with DSC-Environmental Specialist and DSC-Social Safeguard Specialist will conduct Social Due-Diligence of eligible school sites to determine any possible encroachments, third party use and therefore involuntary resettlement issues.
- 63) Field assessments and monitoring of SSEIP's proposed school will be carried out regularly with the approval of Project Director to ensure safeguard compliance.
- 64) Any grievances of local communities will be addressed through the GRM established at PIU-SSEIP level as well as districts' level and will cater to environment, social and gender safeguards.
